# Homeplay

Each month you can learn new practices and techniques to use at home with your child, written by some of the experienced staff working at Snapdragons.

## Identifying your child's interests

### What is my child interested in?

Ask yourself what your child enjoys playing with the most - what is it they do repeatedly? Maybe it is cars, dolls, bricks - maybe all of these. Now ask yourself: why do they play with them?

If your child has several favourite activities look for patterns which link these things together. For example, if your child always chooses to push toy cars back and forth, ride on bikes, push wheelbarrows then they may have a strong interest in transportation, rotation, circles or movement and may choose to play with these items because they are the only things they can find that allow them to explore this interest.

Once your child's key interests have been identified, you may become more aware of what resources you have at home which may provide alternative experiences or perhaps you'd like to plan relevant outings with the family to explore these interests further, for learning is not about the end product or finishing goal but is about the journey, processes and experiences that we have to go through to get there.

### Extend your child's interest with resources

There are many potential interests including lining things up, stacking objects, direction, wrapping, containing and pouring to name just a few. If your child is interested in moving items then you may be able to give them opportunities to do so - ask for their help to put shopping away, or perhaps you have stones in the garden that need to be collected in a bucket and moved. Purchase or create aids to help them complete their mission such as wheelbarrows, prams, diggers, buckets, etc.

Collect kitchen rolls and link them together to make a long tunnel which small balls or cars can pass through to make the way things are transported more interesting. You can also collect yoghurt pots and butter tubs as they are excellent for transporting water or sand from one to the other and by piercing the bottom you provide your child with a simple sieve to make transporting more challenging.

### Role play

#### Treasure baskets

As young babies develop they will begin to discover their own interests so why not help them find out more about the world and themselves and put together your own treasure basket - a collection of items which present young babies and children with the opportunity to explore their senses. Use items such as ribbon, wooden spoons, brushes, wicker balls, shells or feathers.

Perhaps your child is very involved in role play - why not give your child real household objects to play with such as saucepans, wooden spoons, a dustpan and brush or tea towels and empty food and drink containers. You could also use string and clothes pegs to make a child-sized washing line and provide your child with the necessary tools to wash some socks and then hang them in the garden to dry.

Providing your child with real-life objects and opportunities will give them a more fulfilling experience, role play is all about copying grown-ups and entering the world of make believe - think about what it is they see you do every day and try and give them the resources to copy. If your child has gained

a sibling recently then why not give your child some wet wipes, nappy bags and nappies to play with so they may change or bath their own doll.

### Your key person

Discussing information about your child with their key person means that we can continue to provide your child with engaging activities that are more relevant to them. Please feel free to share information about your child's favourite activities, repetitive play, recent or upcoming events or family outings. If you went to the zoo we may spend the day dressing up as lions; if you have friends to stay we may draw them in a picture; by sharing information we can build on your child's experiences and fulfil their learning potential.

# Healthcare

Read about common illnesses and have your questions answered.

## Gastroenteritis

Gastroenteritis is inflammation of the intestinal tract which usually results in diarrhoea (three or more times within 24 hours). Being sick or vomiting is also a common symptom. About 1 in 5 people are affected by gastroenteritis in England every year.

### Signs and symptoms

In addition to diarrhoea and vomiting children affected by gastroenteritis may have:

- Stomach cramps
- Headache
- Aching arms and legs
- High temperature

If diarrhoea and vomiting is severe a child may quickly become dehydrated.

Symptoms may last for as little as 24 hours up to approximately 7 days. Most people make a full recovery within 2-3 days.

### Causes

The most common organisms which cause gastroenteritis are viruses, however bacterial gastroenteritis can also occur. Children are particularly susceptible to these infections and the most common cause is rotavirus. Almost every child will have had this infection by the age of 5. Other viruses that may affect children include norovirus, adenovirus, and astrovirus.

recovered. This should be when they have had no further symptoms for at least 48 hours.

Good hand hygiene with soap and water is very important. You should encourage your child to wash and dry their hands after they have been to the toilet. It is also vital that you wash your hands thoroughly after changing nappies or cleaning up after your child has vomited. You should also pay particular attention to cleaning the toilets in your home as this will help to reduce the spread to others within the household.

### Spread

Gastroenteritis is usually highly infectious. It can be passed very easily from person to person and particularly in environments where children or adults are in close contact with one another; for example nurseries, schools and care homes.

### Treatment

Most people with gastroenteritis have relatively mild symptoms and will usually recover without the need for treatment. If you are concerned that your child's symptoms are not improving or that they may be dehydrated you should contact your GP or ring NHS Direct.

### Preventing the spread of infection

You can help to prevent the spread of infection by keeping your child away from nursery until they have
